Dear Parishioners,

It has been several months since the last issue of the Trophybearer. We pray that this summer that now comes to a close has been a time of rest and peace and renewed strength and love for all of you. As we come now toward the conclusion of the Feast of the

Koimisis of the Theotokos, and of this summer, we approach the renewal of our various ministries and programs at the Church.

A significant alteration in our normal schedule involves the annual Greek Festival, normally held in previous years in late August. In more recent years, we have found that this timing puts us in direct conflict with other neighboring parishes and their Festivals, which both makes it difficult for us to attend and support their efforts, and difficult for their parishioners to attend and support our Festival.

For this reason, we have moved the date almost a month later, and will be having our Greek Festival September 18th. As we make this change, we request the support and participation of all of you, so that it may be a success. Please invite your neighbors and friends from your neighborhoods and workplaces, as well as your friends and relatives from other parishes. Please consider volunteering to help prepare the pastries, or selling tickets, or serving food in the concession stand or at the pastry booth, or simply to be present to help clear tables and remove trash during the festival. A volunteer form is attached to this newsletter - you can turn it in on Sunday in the Church offering, or to the Church office at any time.

We know that not all of you will be able to help with the Festival, either in the preparation or on the day itself. Please know that we understand that life is busy, and there are many other priorities. We hope you do not hesitate to come by whenever you are able on the day of the Festival, to eat, to dance, and to share in fellowship with all the Church. If that is what you can offer, it is a great blessing to all of us.

As September arrives, we also begin our Sunday School and Greek School. We will have sign ups for Sunday School on September 11th and September 18th, and will formally begin classes the following Sunday, on September 25th. Greek School will be beginning shortly after this - please watch the Sunday Bulletin and email updates for more information.

As we conclude the Koimisis Fast, and the month of August, and with them the Ecclesiastical Year, we turn our eyes to the new beginning of the new Church Year, the new school year, and the new year of ministries. We pray that the Lord may richly bless all of us in this new year of His grace.
